



We mourn the premature passing of Ghazala Azmat, Professor of Economics at Sciences Po, who had graciously accepted the invitation to deliver a keynote lecture at our conference.

Ghazala was a brilliant and influential applied microeconomist whose research shaped key debates in labour economics, particularly in the areas of education, gender inequality, and workplace organization. Her work combined rigorous empirical methods with deep concern for how institutions and incentives shape individual decisions and social outcomes. Her insights continue to inform and enrich ongoing research, including many of the papers featured in this programme. Beyond her scholarly achievements, Ghazala was deeply respected for her integrity, generosity, and kindness.

The AIEL community was deeply saddened by her loss and joins the broader economics profession in remembering Ghazala with lasting admiration.




